

FIRST TEAM REPORT 1985/86

First of all the facts: this season we won 12, drew 6 and lost 6 of our 24 games, scoring 77 times and conceding 48 goals; thus ending up with 30 points from a possible 48, which is one less than last season. In all we used, according to my reckoning, 26 players - which must be something of a record in itself - and my thanks go to each one of them for their efforts on behalf of the team this season. Thanks also to Bill Hind and Maurice Dawson for their support in the difficult task of team selection and to the other members of the Executive Committee.

We started the season with high hopes after improving through the latter part of last season to eventually finish fifth, three points behind the second placed club. However, after three excellent friendlies, we had to play Heron and Co-op who were the form teams at that time and only took two points from three games against them. Also at that time we crashed out of both cups: 3-8 to AFC Favourite, who went on to be a force in Division 4; and 2-3 to Edlesborough side Rule and Square, who would not have surprised me had they not won another game all season.

Results through November failed to improve, with the notable exception of a 6-1 thrashing of Park Town who were previously unbeaten. Our League record, then, on 17th November 1985 was:

Obviously a reorganisation was necessary (dare I say that I played in the next three games?). Steve Blackhurst, Alan Palmer and Phil Clarke had been brought into the side and begun to make their influence felt. Things continued to improve, the team stabilized and this turned out to be the start of a run of 14 unbeaten games (including 2 friendlies). The last three of these deserve special mention since they were against two sides challenging us for the runners-up spot to Renault Dodge Reserves, who were running away with the league. We thrashed Royal Oak 5-1 on a windy, rain-sodden Lothair Road pitch, before beating Valley 7-1 and 5-1 in two more superb performances. This left us with two final games against Renault. On a windy Tuesday night we lost to a late solitary goal and on the following Sunday, after having been in the lead three times, we finally lost 3-4.

The disappointment of those two results was enormous, but in the context of the whole season it must be said that in view of the early results, it has been a magnificent achievement to finish third in the league (with still a slight chance of the runners-up spot as I write).


Once again, we have learned the lessons of the season and next season could well be the best the club has had for years, providing we can maintain our impetus.

2ND TEAM REPORT 1985/86

A seemingly successful season but a very unsatisfactory season. We have had some very good results and played some excellent football, notably in the 1-0 victory over Leawood Albion and the display against Midbank before Christmas. However, having grafted our way to the top of the league, and having spent nearly half the season there, we gave away silly results in the latter part of the season to teams who should never have stood a chance. The 1-0 away defeat at Wells Star, 2-1 against Kingsbury and 4-3 against Vauxhall, the loss of these points costing us a promotion place.

This season has seen a continuation of faults which have been recurring for many seasons, silly back passes, not releasing the ball, ignoring calls, wayward passes etc. and sometimes pure disinterest, all of which seemed to plague the second team. However, when you have played over 42 players (at last count), sometimes completely out of position, and turned out with a different back four and very often midfield, I suppose these things should be anticipated.

We have scored, I think, a record number of goals this season, (we don't talk about how many we've conceded) but when you look at the distribution of these goals the value of having one consistent striker is illuminated. I pray that for next season one may yet sign on and we may then keep at least one in the second team.

Thanks go, to all players from all teams for their support, Steve Smith, who has done a wonderful job for the first team, and Maurice and John, for their help and understanding (the third team even let me play sometimes), Dave conscientiously performing the Captain's job, Mick for his constant help and support since his comeback, Andy Thompson for agreeing to come back and having some superb games before he regretably retired from league football (no one will ever forget his heading at ground level), Kevin Tye and Mick Meehan for their help in emergencies, Al Mayman for his help and nagging away in the background, Steve Moreton for an efficient job (Steve I owe you no money), Dave Pymont for his support, help and advice, and finally to Anna for her background help and support, for the team and me, especially whilst I was ill and her tolerance of yet another of my commitments.

Highlights of the season, the 12-1 victory over Beds. Police on Kelvin's 250th appearance (Alan Palmer netted six but we still couldn't set one up for Kelvin), 7-2 against Laporte, 5-5 against British Rail when we equalised from a last minute penalty and many more enjoyable memories.

Regrets of the season, silly defeats, losing Alan Palmer and Phil Clarke before Christmas, not being able to persuade Dave Corbett to put on his boots and the fact that we didn't finish top of the league.




