The opportunities for us to improve and make better use of these facilities are there and I hope all Club members will be able to support your new Chairman Keith Lee and the Committee next season.

FIRST TEAM MANAGER'S REPORT 1988-1989

Once again I am writing these notes in the knowledge that Lea Sports 1st team has achieved its highest ever league placing and in that respect it has been a successful season. We have also found our goalscoring touch again - many of you will know that before the season I set Phil Thompson a target of 12 goals from midfield. He promptly scored 3 hat-tricks in a row and went on to score over 20, whilst Alan Dawson was only one short of 30 first team goals. Our record of 91 league goals will be bettered in all nine divisions only by GIS, the Division 4 champions.

On the debit side, however, is the fact that we have conceded far too many goals to be championship contenders. In our last league game of the season we lost 5-3 to Luton Flying Club. That was the first time they had conceded more than two goals in a match all season - it was the tenth time we had done so. But it must be remembered that preventing goals is the responsibility of the whole team, not just the defence. At times it seems to me that the Club as a whole, not just the first team, does not care enough when goals are conceded and does not give enough commitment to prevent it happening.

Talking of commitment, may I mention two people whose contributions to the Club have been outstanding. Firstly, Ted Ellis of Stopsley Boys Club who has not only represented that Club on our committee, but has also supported us at many games, has run the line, refereed and has generally done everything asked of him to assist what is after all his second club. Also Bill Hind who, as you will see from the records later in this brochure, has been substitute for the second team almost 100 times and who this season has also run the line, refereed and generally helped out whenever necessary—and all this without ever having been a first choice selection for the first team. The contribution of both these people has been exceptional and I thank them very much.

Also a mention for all the other Executive Committee members without whom the Club would cease to exist, especially Al Mayman as Chairman and Dave Blake's success with the reserves.

As far as selection goes it has been a bit of an experimental season, by keeping a very tight-knit squad of players. Only 18 players have started a first team game. Of these two played only three games between them and two are goalkeepers. I am sure there have been second team players this season who have been disappointed at not getting a regular chance - even more so when some first team players have objected to being substituted or being asked to start as substitute.

Next season the priority has to be to concede fewer goals. I expect that this, plus the possible influx of some players from Stopsley Boys Club, will increase the competition for first team places. If goals are conceded, changes will be made: it's as simple as that. It will probably mean a drop in my personality ratings with some people, but you can't be nice to everyone and win championships. We must concede fewer goals.

SECOND TEAM MANAGER'S REPORT 1988-1989

Early season results ensured that once again the second team had no real chance of gaining league success. However, on reflection there is no reason to be pessimistic about prospects for next season. Form in 1989 was extremely impressive with just one defeat in ten games. The team's defence improved dramatically over the season as the statistics undoubtedly prove (20 goals conceded in the first 6 games; 21 in the remaining 14).

Many players contributed over the season, but special mention should be given to a few individuals who played particularly well. Dave Newman, despite one or two aberrations, was an inspiration on several occasions. Paul Gathern (perhaps the oldest new boy) was often the most skilful player on the pitch and proved an ideal 'team player'. Phil Clarke once again showed himself to be an ace goal poacher, while Rick Vipers was always a willing target man. Consistent performances came from Kelvin Callow, Charlie McNerney, Ali Hearn, Steve Moorhouse and Mark Turner (his appearances in goal will be remembered by all involved in the last two games). Hugh Byrne's improvement over the season was especially noteworthy and Dave Harris's skill will be missed next year. All teams depend on the versatile player who can fill in many positions and I am thankful to John Darley who performed that role without complaining throughout the campaign.

I would like to record my thanks also to several other club members who made my job much easier. First of all Steve Smith, who all in Lea Sports should appreciate is probably the driving force behind the Club. Al Mayman whose commitment is total. Rick Vipers and Steve Moorhouse the two captains who were always supportive and often helped me to make decisions when I was too absorbed in playing to think clearly. Thanks also to Jim Gahagan, Geoff Richardson and Mark Turner who were supportive throughout.

This has been a season on which we must build. The Club undoubtedly possesses the best first team it has ever had and all efforts must be made to ensure that they play at the top levels in future seasons.

The second team can cash in on the first team's potential and gain success for ourselves if only we can keep fielding good teams throughout the season. This is especially the case in September and I appeal to all members to drive to make yourselves available at the beginning of the season.

THIRD TEAM MANAGERS' REPORT 1988-1989

The decision to enter the South Beds.Sunday League, taken at a Special E.G.M. in the hope of securing regular fixtures against opposition of a similar standard provided a new challenge for the 1988-89 season. However, within a few weeks of the start of the season, we were to be disappointed on both counts. The league fixtures left many gaps where friendlies had to be arranged, often at very short notice and the standard of the opposition proved to be stronger than anticipated.

As the campaign progressed we were to call on the services of 60 players or more to complete the programme of 20 league games (six wins) and 7 friendlies (one win). The number of players used, combined with numerous injuries and positional changes contributed to an unsettling effect on the team. A list of the players would make a lengthy passage in this report but we would like to thank them all for their efforts and we would particularly mention Andy Thompson who made 19 starts and Tony Ingram, Neil Hebron and Tony Riley who made 18 starts in the team. Also the amazing goal contributions of Phil Thompson (14 goals from 5 appearances) and Alan Dawson (13 from 4).

Both on and off the field we have been helped by the Selection Committee, especially Steve Smith and Dave Blake who have given great support. Also Andy Bignell's role as secretary and Ken Beavan's willingness to captain the side and help in the management. We must not forget Bill Hind and Phil Charles who turned out on numerous occasions to substitute for the illusive referees. (I think you mean 'elusive' Jim - 'illusive' means 'deceptive' - Editor's note)

Team performances have been rather erratic. To highlight the extremes only we have to remember the despair of watching the performance against White Horse in a cup match. As goals against mounted spirit eroded away to end in a 0-17 drubbing. On the other hand, in the league match against the Rose and Crown, then league leaders, the fighting qualities shone through.

The team recovered from a terrible start, 0-3 down, to have them on the 'rack' at 2-3 for most of the second half before conceding late goals. This recovery was partly due to the inspiring performance of Dave Pymont (possibly the oldest player on the field) who combined so well with Steve Moorhouse on the left side of the field.

One of the most humorous situations was early in the season in a game against Toddington Social at Flitwick where after dominating the early exchanges their captain was heard to shout when the score was still 0-0, "Come on lads, all you have to do is score!" This was immediately answered by one of our midfield players, to which our left-back replied, "That's the way to do it!". This breakthrough resulted in a 0-6 defeat.

On the brighter side we were able to introduce a number of new playing members to Lea Sports; on the other hand we have witnessed a number of players lose heart and drift away from the Club.

The use of regular First and Second team players at the end of the season to provide some respectability to our league programme will, we hope, both have helped some of our younger players gain confidence for next season and also perhaps let those First and Second team players realise the standard of teams we have been up against.

Finally, we would like to thank the girls in the background who must dread the arrival of the black kit bag on Sunday afternoon, but all the same ensure that we are well turned-out the next week.

Alan Dawson first appeared in the third team in 1980/1 (aged 15). In 1982/3 he played one first team game. Also in 1982/3 he scored his first goals for the Club: a hat-trick for the 3rd XI vs. Central Round Table (we lost 5-8).
