Under 12 Jaguars Season's Report - 2023-24

The Jaguars proved themselves a tough and resilient bunch over a challenging under-12s season in the Chiltern Junior Sevens League, division two. A mid-table finish was fine reward for a campaign in which the boys had to dig deep and they were rewarded in spring with a strong run of results, ending with three wins in a row, that carried them up the table.

Consistency was always going to be difficult to achieve with Hitchin Boys' School sport calling on the lads for rugby, hockey and cricket. But they found their groove and did themselves proud across all 27 matches. The final seven games showed the boys' true potential, with four wins making them the fourth 'hottest' form team in the division. The Jags ended seventh out of 12, with the table showing P22 W8 D2 L12 GD -17 PTS 26.
