Under 16 Lions Season's Report - 2023-2024

The new season saw us welcome Carrick and Ty as new players to the Lions squad. A few preseason training sessions got us in shape for our only friendly fixture against Baldock. Having played many tight games against them in recent seasons it was a good barometer of how ready we were for the season ahead. In hindsight, it probably summarised the season to come perfectly. A really strong performance but could only see us draw 1-1. The positive was that Carrick got his Lea Sports goal scoring off to a quick start.

As winners of Division 2 of the Royston Crow League last season it was always going to be interesting to see how we performed after the promotion to Division 1. Unfortunately other teams in the league didn't fancy their chances in their prospective divisions and so the season started with 3 mini-leagues to ensure that each team was pitched against the right level of opposition.

The first of the mini-leagues of 6 teams was a really solid showing for the boys and proved we were able to mix it with anyone; winning two, drawing two and only losing one. The first of those competitive games was against Saffron Walden who ran us all the way to the final game of the season last year. Clearly losing the title to us was still on their minds and in a feisty affair it was a great credit to the Lions who kept calm heads and came away with a great 3-1 win.

October saw us start and finish our cup run for the year. Making the long away trip to Manuden we put in one of our best performances of the season in almost every aspect other than finishing. Some 'interesting' refereeing decisions also conspired against us and we lost 2-1. It's not often that the opposition manager also recognises that his team were undeserving winners but that was scant consolation.

October also saw the start of the 'proper' league season. Unfortunately the performance in the mini leagues didn't really help us in the end as the points from that were scrapped as we started again in a slightly expanded Division 1.

The fixture secretary clearly had it in mind to make our season as tricky as possible. After the restart we faced a run of six away games in a row and most of those against teams who would eventually finish at the top end of the table.

The new year started with another away trip to Manuden where we were able to avenge the cup defeat and a good 2-1 victory but we never really built any momentum after that. The weather meant that we didn't play a single match in February. The rest of our season was up and down in terms of results but followed a pretty consistent pattern; often the better team, dominating large periods of play but unable to kill games off.

The best performance of the season was against Melbourn in early April where we played great football, looked totally solid and never gave them a look in. They were lucky to go away having only been beaten 2-0. The lowlight was obviously our abandoned game against Manuden and the less said about that the better. Let's hope we never have to play them again.
